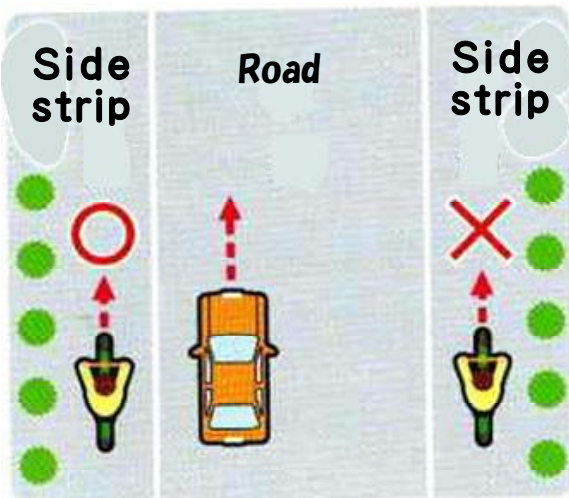
※In this context, “bicycle”

❖ As a general rule, bicycles should be ridden on the left side of the road.



A bicycle is classified as a “non-motorized vehicle.”

Like cars, bicycles must travel on the road (including any side strip).

- Even if there is no side strip, the bicycle must stay on the left side of the road.
- When overtaken by a car, stay as far left as possible.
- Obstructing the movement of cars could be a violation!

So, is riding on the sidewalk prohibited?
Are sidewalks only for pedestrians?

Exceptions concerning sidewalk passage



On sidewalks marked with this sign, bicycles are permitted. However, they must keep to the side of the sidewalk that is closest to the road.

← Sign indicating that bicycles are permitted on sidewalks.



As a general rule

- Pedestrians have priority on sidewalks.
- You must travel at a speed that allows you to stop immediately if necessary (i.e., ride slowly).
- You must stop if you are likely to obstruct pedestrian traffic.



There are also situations where you may ride on the sidewalk even without a sign !



Please do not forget to wear a helmet!



① The cyclist is a child under 13, a person 70 years or older, or someone with a specified physical disability.



② The road is under construction, the lane is too narrow, or traffic is so heavy that riding on the road would be unsafe.



The placement of signs varies according to local road conditions.
